

## **Remittance of Payments**

### **Membership Dues**

To be considered a state member in good standing, state membership dues must be paid by August 31 of the renewal year. To be considered a corporate member in good standing, corporate dues must be paid by January 31 annually. Lack of payment may result in cancellation of benefits, including the inability to register for events.

### **Prorated Dues**

Prorated dues may apply to new corporate members joining after June 1 each calendar year. This does not apply to companies that have previously been members, unless the membership has lapsed for longer than two years. New state members may receive prorated dues if joining after January 1. This does not apply to states that have previously been members, unless the membership has lapsed for longer than two years.

### **Sponsorship Payments**

Beginning January 1, 2020, sponsorships must be paid 30 days prior to the sponsored event. NASCA reserves the right to cancel a sponsorship and company registrations if payment is not received in full 30 days prior to the event and cannot guarantee any sponsorship deliverables until payment is received in full. All sponsorship fees and payments are nonrefundable and non-cancelable. NASCA reserves the right to revoke or prevent a Corporate Partner's participation in the event of non-payment. New corporate members who become members of NASCA less than 60 days prior to the start of an event may be provided a payment grace period of 30 days from invoicing for membership and sponsorship payment.

### **Late Payments**

NASCA will charge a \$50 processing fee per attendee for any registrations made after the published cutoff date. NASCA will also charge 2% compounding interest per month after the payment due date for any outstanding memberships and sponsorships. States may request late payment processing fee to be waived if occurring in the event of transition of membership or state hardship.
